

Registered Traveler Information and Status Update For the Clients of Travel-On, LTD

Background: In the wake of the 9/11 tragedy, increased airport security has caused numerous delays and inconveniences for travelers. The Transportation Security Administration, through private vendors, is in the process of implementing a Registered Traveler program. The RT program will allow travelers an expedited route through security if they undergo and pass a voluntary TSA-conducted Security Threat Assessment (STA).

How it works: The TSA has approved several private companies including **CLEAR** to facilitate the enrollment and verification process. Travelers pay these companies a fee (typically \$130.00/year, \$30.00 of which goes to TSA who does the STA) and provide personal and biometric information to help TSA do a background check on the traveler. Upon approval, the traveler is issued a registered traveler card which he will insert into a machine at the airport. The card, coupled with a biometric scan (either retinal or fingerprint), will allow the traveler to enter a special expedited line to clear security.

Benefits: The benefits, which may vary by airport, include:

- modified airport configuration to minimize RT passenger wait times, including dedicated or integrated lines and lanes
- enhanced customer service for RT participants, such as divesting assistance, concierge service for luggage, and parking privileges
- discounts for services or concessions.

Availability:

Travelers: travelers who are U.S. citizens, lawful permanent resident aliens, or nationals of the United States are eligible to enroll in the program. Acceptance is predicated on the results of the STA.

Airports: The program's availability at various airports is dependent on TSA approval of that airport facility and it independent of the enrollment company used. Currently, the following airports are currently approved in the registered traveler program.
